Our History

The Mechanics Institute purchased a failing Temperance Hotel 1892

Created teaching rooms and a home for a library this became The Guildford Institute 1964

Let the ground floor and basement of the Institute to Williams & Glyn's Bank and subsequently The Royal Bank of Scotland (RBS), to provide us with income to subsidise our core purpose to offer educational activities - in an economically viable way



September 2024

Works in our new Community & Wellbeing Hub were completed, with all therapy rooms let at the point of completion to a total of 14 therapists, counsellors and psychologists.

November 2024

The hub was officially opened at a welcome event by the Institute's patron, The Mayor of Guildford, Sallie Barker MBE, alongside our local MP, Zoe Franklin.



Partnerships & Fundraising

Despite the successes at the GI, we still have e a significant gap in our finances following the loss of the rental from our previous ground-floor tenant, and in the face of the current economic climate. A key goal for the way forward is to focus on addressing this by extending our reach into the community with a greater number of partnerships with like-minded organisations. We are also planning to launch fundraising campaigns and apply

for grants to secure additional funding.

Growing our programme

We will continue to grow our programme offering and audience, through the addition of new activities and making use of our greatest asset – our historic building – by utilising it throughout the year. By doing this, we will ensure that we're providing as much as possible for the community.

About the Role

The Chair will provide strategic leadership, supporting the GI to achieve its mission, secure its longevity and thrive.

Leading Effective Governance

- Have a strong commitment to the GI, its members and users, working in a way that reflects the vision and values of our charity.
- Lead the Board of Trustees and staff team in ensuring operational decisions contribute to strategic priorities.
- Ensure there is effective and regular communication within the Board of Trustees.
- Proactively maintain positive relationships between Trustees, the staff team and volunteers.
- Give the Board of Trustees a clear lead and direction and ensure trustees work together as an effective team.
- Ensure the Board of Trustees guide the staff team in utilising resources responsibly and effectively.
- Ensure trustees understand their responsibilities.
- Ensure trustees are committed to, and working towards, developing the GI and securing its longevity.
- Set the culture of the Board of Trustees.
- Ensure the Board of Trustees understands the scope of any issues they need to consider and is clear about the decisions that need to be made.
- Lead on discussions and decisions about what actions to delegate to specific trustees and subgroups.

Key Responsibilities and Relationships

- Work closely with the Board of Trustees, Institute Manager and the rest of the staff team to ensure the smooth running and development of the GI.
- Lead the Board of Trustees, ensuring strong governance and strategic direction.
- Have a thorough understanding and knowledge of the GI, its history, the local area and community that it serves.
- Ensure the oversight of the financial performance of the GI, and the effective use of its resources.
- Act as an ambassador for the GI, helping to raise its profile and awareness in the local community.
- Support fundraising and financial sustainability, focusing on securing grant funding and proactively forming partnerships that support the GI's strategic goals.
- Foster an inclusive and collaborative culture.
- Think strategically about the future direction of the GI and the steps involved to achieve these goals.
- Provide strong leadership of organisational change, particularly during challenging times
- Set goals for the GI and work collaboratively with the Board of Trustees and staff team to achieve these.
